



Your Destiny Is Not an Abandoned Project in the Hands of God

There are moments in life when people, even believers, feel forgotten by destiny. When dreams are delayed, when doors of opportunities are closed, when the destiny helpers disappeared and when strength weakens.

In this moment, many believers privately wonder, “Has God forgotten me?” “Is my season over?” or “Can anything good still come out of my life?”

2 Corinthians 4:7-9 | Job 14:7-9

The Holy Spirit sent me to encourage, reassure, and to prophetically declare over your life that your destiny is not an abandoned project in the hands of God.

God never begins what He cannot finish. He is Alpha and Omega — the Author and Finisher of our faith. The enemy may attack your progress, but he cannot cancel God’s purpose for your life. Your current condition is not your final conclusion. Even the best of you today is still not your conclusion. The best is still coming your way.

A Few Truths about your destiny you must know

1. God Never Abandons What He Has Ordained

Your destiny is God’s earthly project. And God will not abandon and leave it unfulfilled. God does not start projects and walk away from them.

Philippians 1:6, *“He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ”.*

Men may give up on you, family and friends may misunderstand you, and society may write you off. But God has not and cannot cancel your file.



You are not just one of the billions of people on earth, but, through redemption, you are God's planted vision for the recovery of others. And if God planted the vision, He will sustain the vision. God plants your destiny, and He will nourish it into fruition.

Examples in Scripture. Joseph was thrown into a pit, but the pit was not the end. God nourished his dream, and in the end, despite all the opposition, his dream manifested. Your dream will manifest, and your vision will speak in the end.

Genesis 42:5-6

My brothers and sisters, delay is not denial, and silence is not abandonment. Even though it may seem God is silent. He has not forgotten or abandoned you. He is working, and He will fulfill His vision regarding your destiny.

2. Your Time is Not Over

Many people mistake a difficult season for a finished destiny. But one bad chapter in a story does not end the entire story. As long as God remains on the throne, your future still exists, your purpose still matters, and the great testimony of your rising can still emerge.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 | Micah 7:8,

My brothers and sisters, let me tell you today that the enemy celebrated too early over your life. God is announcing resurrection over your destiny today.

3. Circumstances Cannot Dismiss Your Purpose

Many people judge destiny by visible circumstances. As human beings, our conclusions are based on physical environmental conditions. But God does not consult circumstances before fulfilling prophecy.

Romans 4:17, *"...callesth those things which be not as though they were."*



Your environment may say, "It is Impossible, it is too late, you have been forgotten, your marriage is damaged beyond repair, or it is finished. But I want you to know who God is and what He does best. God specializes in impossible situations.

Look at the Dry Bones Prophecy in Ezekiel 37:1–10. The bones were: dry, scattered, lifeless, and hopeless. Yet God asked: "Can these bones live?"

Ezekiel 37:10 (KJV), *"So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived, and stood up upon their feet, an exceeding great army".*

My brothers and sisters, what looked finished to man was still recoverable to God.

Some destinies are not dead – they are waiting for prophetic revival.

This is why you must never conclude your destiny by your current pain. Pain is temporary. Purpose is eternal. And God is working to bring your destiny into perfect fulfillment. Don't give up because the creator of your destiny has not and will never give up on you.

4. Don't Reach Conclusions About Your Life by Temporary Circumstances. No Condition is permanent.

Elijah Thought It Was Over. In **1 Kings 19:4 (KJV)**, the Bible says,

"But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers".

Elijah asked God to take his life. Yet shortly after, heaven still used him mightily.

Temporary storms often produce permanent wrong conclusions.



What about the disciples? The Disciples Thought Jesus Was Finished. When Christ died on the cross, they believed the story had ended. None of them remembered to come to the sepulcher but Mary. Nevertheless, resurrection morning proved:

God works beyond graves, beyond disappointment, and beyond human conclusions.

My brothers and sisters, what you call “ending” may be God’s setup for resurrection.

5. Your Divine Season of Restoration is Here

God restores: wasted years, lost opportunities, damaged or forgotten dreams, broken confidence, and abandoned visions.

Joel 2:25

Restoration means recovering strength, identity, joy, favor, and purpose. Heaven can restore what you lost spiritually, emotionally, financially, in your marriage, or in your ministry. God can restore in one season what took years to lose.

6. God’s resurrection ability is proof that God finishes what He starts

The resurrection of Jesus is heaven’s declaration that darkness does not win, death does not have the final word, and hopelessness is not permanent in God’s project.

If Jesus rose again, therefore, your destiny can rise again. If the stone can be rolled away from the tomb, the finger of God can move every obstacle before your destiny and purpose.

If God resurrected Christ, He can resurrect: your destiny, your family, your health, your finances, your purpose, and your future.

However, if you want to see God's purpose for your destiny, family, health, and finances, to stand and be fulfilled in this life, you must give God something to work with.

In this dispensation of grace, God does not work in a vacuum. The grace of God is constantly available to believers, but God does not act on His promises for believers without their faith. Your faith in God, His word, and His ability to do what He says is a requirement and not a suggestion.

One important thing that God recognizes and acts upon in our walk with Him is our faith. Your personal faith and not our faith. Faith in God is personal.

A. Our personal faith in God

My fellow believers, there is no way for any of us to see God's purpose fulfilled in our lives outside our personal faith in God.

What is faith?

- **Hebrews 11:1 (KJV)**, *“Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen”*.
- **Hebrews 11:7 (KJV)**, *“By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith”*.
- **Hebrews 11:17-19 (KJV)**, *“By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son. Of whom it was said, that in Isaac shall thy seed be called. Accounting that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure”*.



Faith is not a statement. Faith is more than hearing and knowing. Faith is hearing, knowing, and doing. Doing what the word says is what triggers the hands of God in heaven.

- Taking the actions that look stupid and foolish to men because of what God says is called faith.
- Embarking on a journey not well understood, because God commanded it, is called faith.
- The costly and painful sacrifices that God instructed are called faith.

B. Give God your total obedience

Giving God your total obedience means surrendering your heart, will, actions, and decisions completely to Him.

The pathway that unlocks divine manifestation, breakthrough, favor, and miracles is obedience.

- Partial obedience is still disobedience.
- Disobedience is a sin against God.

Jesus said in **John 14:15 (KJV)**, *"If ye love me, keep my commandments."*

Abraham's obedience made God swear by His throne concerning him and his descendants.

The blueprint of your destiny is in the instructions God gives you. Disobeying God's instruction means you are rejecting your destiny.

- Your destiny is not an abandoned project in the hands of God.
- The steps you take will eventually determine the success of your destiny.
- God has been waiting for you to take a step that will manifest and fulfill your destiny.
- But because of doubt, fear, disobedience, and temporary circumstances, we fail to respond in faith.



Prophetic Declaration:

- Every buried destiny in my family shall rise again in Jesus' name.
- My season is not over; my testimony shall emerge.
- Every voice declaring my end shall be silenced.
- God shall complete what He started in my life.
- Every delayed promise shall enter fulfillment.
- Dry bones in my destiny shall receive life again.
- I shall not die in disappointment.
- My divine purpose shall prevail over opposition.
- Every lost year shall be restored to me by mercy.
- My rising shall shock those who gave up on me.
- My destiny shall not be abandoned midway.
- The power of resurrection shall revive every dead area of my life.
- By resurrection power, I shall arise again and fulfill destiny.

Conclusion: Your present struggle is not God's final report about your life and destiny. God has not abandoned your destiny. Your time is not over. Your purpose still stands. And the best news is that your restoration season has arrived.

Men may count you out, but God still counts you in. The same God who raised Jesus from the dead is still able to resurrect dreams, restore wasted or delayed years, and revive dying destinies.

Your story is not ending in defeat. You shall rise again. And faith in God and His ability to do what He says is a requirement.
