

THE GOD OF NEW BEGINNINGS

There are moments in our lives when God does not merely repair, replace, or reinstate the old. He creates the new. There are seasons when God says: “You have cried long enough. You have waited long enough. You have gone around this mountain long enough. A new chapter is necessary”.

Isaiah 43:18–19 | Isaiah 42:9 | Revelation 21:5 | Genesis 1:1–3 | 2 Corinthians 5:17

Isaiah 43:19 (KJV), *“Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.”*

Notice that God did not say, “I may do a new thing.” He said, “I WILL do a new thing.” I consider this as the language of divine determination by God.

Therefore, declare by faith: MY NEW BEGINNING HAS COME!

1. OUR GOD IS THE GOD OF NEW BEGINNINGS

In Genesis 1:1, the Bible begins with these words: “In the beginning God.” So, before anything began, God was there. This means that whenever God steps into a situation, He has the power to create another beginning.

Your past may explain where you have been, but it does not have the authority to determine where God is taking you.

- Failure is not necessarily your final destination.
- Delay is not denial.
- Disappointment may hurt you so much but it is designed to be your final destination.
- A closed chapter does not mean the whole book is finished.

If God is still involved, another chapter can begin. You may have fallen, you may have failed, and you may have made some costly mistakes, but you can also begin again.

When God entered creation in Genesis 1, the earth was without form, empty, and covered in darkness. Yet God did not abandon it. God said, "Let there be light." And darkness gave way to light. This tells us something powerful about God.

Some of God's greatest interventions were carried out in places that looked hopeless.

- My brothers and sisters, where you see emptiness, God sees possibility.
- Where you see darkness, God sees an opportunity for light.
- Where you see an ending, God sees a beginning.

Today, God is DECLARING light over every dark area of your life!

- Where there has been confusion, let there be direction.
- Where there has been sorrow, let there be joy.
- Where there has been stagnation, let there be movement.
- Where there has been barrenness, let there be fruitfulness.
- Where there has been disappointment, let there be divine appointment.
- Where there has been sickness, let there be wholeness. Amen!

2. GOD CAN BEGIN AGAIN WITH YOU

Jeremiah gives us a remarkable picture of what God can do.

Jeremiah 18:4-6

I love those words. HE MADE IT AGAIN. The vessel became marred, but the Potter did not throw away the clay. He started again.

This is what grace can do for those who believe. The enemy may say, you have made too many mistakes, you have wasted too much time, you have blown too many opportunities, you are too old, and you have gone too far in the wrong direction.

But the Potter (Your God, the creator) says, “I CAN MAKE YOU AGAIN.”

- God can give you another opportunity.
- God can restore your usefulness.
- God can rebuild your confidence.
- God can restore your spiritual fire.
- God can restore your family.
- God can revive your destiny.
- God can reposition your destiny.

Your mistake does not have to become your permanent identity.

Peter denied Jesus three times, yet Jesus restored him, and Peter became a powerful voice of the early church. Jonah ran away from God’s assignment, but God came and spoke to him again.

Don’t forget, there is a God of the second, third, or more chances according to His endless mercy.

Declare this: MY STORY IS NOT OVER.

3. A NEW BEGINNING REQUIRES RELEASING THE OLD.

Isaiah 43:18 says, *“Remember ye not the former things, neither consider the things of old.”* Then verse 19 says, *“Behold, I will do a new thing”*

Sometimes it is difficult, if not totally impossible, to embrace what God is beginning because we are still emotionally attached to what has ended. There are old disappointments, betrayals, failures, offenses, regrets, hurts, and failed expectations that must be surrendered to God.

You cannot walk effectively into your tomorrow while constantly staring into yesterday. If you pay much of your time looking at the rear mirror, there is a possibility that you will not get to your destination alive.

Philippians 3:13

God is saying, “Stop allowing yesterday’s pain to cancel tomorrow’s possibilities.”

4. GOD CAN CREATE A ROAD WHERE THERE IS NO ROAD

Isaiah 43:19, *“I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.”*

- What is wilderness? A wilderness is where roads are difficult to find.
- A desert is where water is not expected.

Yet God says, “I will put a road where you cannot see a road, and I will put water where you don’t expect water.” That means your new beginning is not limited by natural possibilities.

When human resources are finished, divine resources are not. When human connections have failed, God’s connection has not failed. When people say, “There is no way,” God says, “I WILL MAKE A WAY.”

Israel stood before the Red Sea. The sea was ahead. Pharaoh was behind. Mountains were around them. There appeared to be no escape. But **Exodus 14:21** tells us God opened the sea. And at God's instruction, Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go *back* by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea dry *land*, and the waters were divided. God did not show Moses an existing road or repair a destroyed bridge. God created a road.

There are breakthroughs lined up for you that you do not currently see a pathway to.

But you don't have to know how God will do it. All you have to know is that God can do what He says and then believe it. (**Isaiah 55:8-9**). For my thoughts are not your thoughts, and my ways are not your ways.

Prophetic Word/Prayer: God who made a highway through the Red Sea, come and create a way for me where I see no way. Create a solution where I see none and give me water to drink where I see no river.

5. NEW BEGINNINGS CAN HAPPEN SUDDENLY

Some things take time to develop, but there are also moments when God's intervention suddenly changes circumstances.

One moment Joseph was a prisoner. Then Pharaoh sent for him. Before the day ended, Joseph had moved from the prison to the palace. One encounter changed his story. One divine connection changed his position. One opportunity changed his status. One day changed the trajectory of his destiny.

Genesis 41:14-41

Prophetic Declaration/Prayer:

God, grant me an encounter that will introduce a new chapter of my life!

Grant me (your):

- Divine opportunity to change my situation.
- Divine connection to open the right door for me.
- One answered prayer to terminate my years of tears
- Supernatural intervention to change the direction of my family for good.

6. WHEN GOD BEGINS SOMETHING NEW, OLD LIMITATIONS MUST GIVE WAY

In John 5, the man at Bethesda had been in his condition for 38 years. His condition was old. His disappointment was old. His explanation was old. But one word from Jesus terminated thirty-eight years of limitation. *“Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.”*

There are situations that have existed so long that people begin to accept them as permanent. Just because it has been there for years does not mean it has permission to remain forever.

Today, in the name of Jesus, a divine change is happening in your life. Jesus is still Lord.

Hebrews 13:8, *“Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever.”*

Therefore, we can still pray boldly, trust God’s wisdom, and expect His intervention.

Prayer Points:

1. Prayer of Surrender: Father, I surrender every old thing that is hindering the new thing You desire to do in my life. Give me grace to release the past and embrace Your purpose for my future, in Jesus' name.
2. Prayer Against Stagnation: Every cycle of stagnation and repeated frustration in my life, break in the name of Jesus!
3. Prayer for Fresh Doors: Father, open the doors that belong to my next season, according to Your will, in Jesus' name.
4. Prayer for Restoration: God of restoration, breathe upon every good thing that has become weak, broken, or dormant in my life.
5. Prayer for Divine Direction: Lord, make a way for me in every wilderness and give me clear direction where I have been confused.
6. Prayer for Healing: Jesus Christ, our Healer, stretch forth Your hand and bring healing, strength, and restoration to those who are afflicted.
7. Prayer for Families: Father, let a new season of salvation, peace, unity, restoration, and spiritual awakening begin in my/our families.

Conclusion: Do not build your future around your yesterday. The God who created light from darkness is still God. The God who made a road through the sea is still God. The God who restored Job is still God. The God who moved Joseph from prison to palace is still God. The Jesus who told a thirty-eight-year invalid to rise is still Lord. Therefore, expect a new beginning. Pray for a new beginning. Prepare for a new beginning. And walk by faith into your new beginning. For the Lord says, "Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth. THE OLD SEASON IS OVER. GOD HAS BROUGHT ME INTO A NEW BEGINNING."
